THE WORD OF THE DAY

OLD TESTAMENT: GENESIS 45:3-8A, 15 (found on page 39 of your pew Bibles)

Joseph said to his brothers, "I am Joseph! Is my father still living?" But his brothers were not able to answer him, because they were terrified at his presence.

Then Joseph said to his brothers, "Come close to me." When they had done so, he said, "I am your brother Joseph, the one you sold into Egypt! And now, do not be distressed and do not be angry with yourselves for selling me here, because it was to save lives that God sent me ahead of you. For two years now there has been famine in the land, and for the next five years there will be no plowing and reaping. But God sent me ahead of you to preserve for you a remnant on earth and to save your lives by a great deliverance. So then, it was not you who sent me here, but God.

And he kissed all his brothers and wept over them. Afterward his brothers talked with him. (NIV2011)

EPISTLE: COLOSSIANS 1:3-8 (found on page 953 of your pew Bibles)

******This will also serve as our sermon text ******

We always thank God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, when we pray for you, because we have heard of your faith in Christ Jesus and of the love you have for all God's people — the faith and love that spring from the hope stored up for you in heaven and about which you have already heard in the true message of the gospel that has come to you. In the same way, the gospel is bearing fruit and growing throughout the whole world — just as it has been doing among you since the day you

heard it and truly understood God's grace. You learned it from Epaphras, our dear fellow servant, who is a faithful minister of Christ on our behalf, and who also told us of your love in the Spirit. (NIV2011)

Verse of the Day: *Alleluia. Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. Alleluia. (John 6:68 cf. NIV)*

GOSPEL: LUKE 6:27-38 (found on page 837 of your pew Bibles) After the gospel is announced, we join to sing: "**Glory be to you O, Lord'** (*twice*)

(Jesus said:) "Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you. If someone slaps you on one cheek, turn to them the other also. If someone takes your coat, do not withhold your shirt from them. Give to everyone who asks you, and if anyone takes what belongs to you, do not demand it back. Do to others as you would have them do to you.

"If you love those who love you, what credit is that to you? Even sinners love those who love them. And if you do good to those who are good to you, what credit is that to you? Even sinners do that. And if you lend to those from whom you expect repayment, what credit is that to you? Even sinners lend to sinners, expecting to be repaid in full. But love your enemies, do good to them, and lend to them without expecting to get anything back. Then your reward will be great, and you will be children of the Most High, because he is kind to the ungrateful and wicked. Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful.

"Do not judge, and you will not be judged. Do not condemn, and you will not be condemned. Forgive, and you will be forgiven. Give, and it will be given to you. A good measure, pressed down, shaken together and running over, will be poured into your lap. For with the measure you use, it will be measured to you." (NIV2011) / We join to sing: '**Praise be to you, O Christ'** (*twice*)

The Nicene Creed: (also found on page 18 in the front of CW)

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one being with the Father.

Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation, He came down from heaven, was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the virgin Mary, and became fully human. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate. He suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven, and is

seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and His kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who in unity with the Father and the Son is worshiped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy Christian and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

The Lord's Prayer

Our Father, who art in heaven, Hallowed be Thy name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For Thine is the kingdom, and the power and the glory forever and ever. Amen.

The Sacrament: We continue with the preparations for receiving the Lord's Supper as found in the very middle of the blue CW handout, right side, under the Lord's Prayer.

The Distribution: If you are a guest or visitor, you may be interested and relieved to know that we do not seek to impose our practice of Holy Communion upon you. In fact God's Word

makes it clear that He intends this sacrament only for those who have been made familiar in advance with the sacrament (1 Corinthians 11:27-30), and who have previously expressed their *fellowship* with the group they are taking it with, since it is a public confession of oneness in faith (1 Corinthians 10:17 & 11:24-26); that is what is meant by the Scriptural practice of “*close communion*”. If you are a guest or visitor and have not had the chance to express common faith and a public declaration of fellowship with us, please observe today’s communion service and speak with Pastor after the service or during the week; he’d be delighted to help you appreciate a “close” relationship with our congregation. Communicant member of our sister WELS or ELS congregations are welcome, but please announce your intent to commune with us to pastor or an usher before the service. **A ‘Personal Preparation for Holy Communion’ tool can be found on page 156** at the front of Christian Worship; this is an excellent tool for ‘examining ourselves’ prior to communing, as a Christ commands (1 Corinthians 11:28).

New Tuesday Bible Study Topic – THIS Tuesday, February 26th, our Tuesday AM Bible study (10-11am) will begin a NEW topic: Pietism, as we study: *'The Great Lie of Pietism: Looking for Heaven on Earth.'* The 6 week course introduction says: *"This course will familiarize us with what pietism is, and some of the American groups who championed it: Ephratha Cloister (aka the Community of the Solitary in Pennsylvania), Zoar (The Society of Separatists in Ohio), Oneida (The Perfectionists in New York), Amana Colonies (The Inspirationists in Iowa), The Shakers (the United Society of Believers in Christ's Second Coming). The problems that Pietism introduced in the 1600's are very much alive today among many mainline churches in the U.S.; a de-emphasis of doctrine, the role of acceptance theology, the concept that one must first live a sanctified life before there can be any hope of salvation, are all part of Pietist teachings. When we look at many of the evangelists that have risen to fame today, we see strong leanings toward Pietism. It would do well for our church members to recognize what these teachings are, where these leanings originated, and what their consequences might be. Another reason this course may be of some value is that many of our church members have visited the museums and buildings left by the pietistic communal societies listed above; their curators and docents can give wonderful tours, but they often miss the religious details behind the scenes that caused these societies to exist. This class will give members a true background to these religious groups."* Why not join us?

Festival of Friendship – NEXT Sunday, March 3rd, we are asking you to invite someone you know who isn't actively going to church on a regular basis to join you for worship here with us. On that day we are celebrating Jesus' Transfiguration, which helped prepare Jesus and His disciples for Jesus' suffering and death for mankind's salvation. This account also helps us better understand Jesus' passion. What a great preparation for Lent, which begins March 6th! Invite your friends to see God's love for them with us at this special service!

Midweek Lenten Services – begin on **Ash Wednesday**, March 6th at 6:30pm, and will continue each Wednesday until Holy Week to help us prepare our hearts to meditate on Jesus' Passion and what it means for us. This year's theme is: *'3 Words of Truth: Passion Statements of Our Savior.'* ***Our local pastors will again be pulpit rotating for these midweek services, after Ash Wednesday***; Ash Wednesday will be a special service at each church. Join us as we watch and pray with Jesus an extra hour each week this Lenten season! And please note that the Ash Wednesday service on March 6th is a communion service.
