BIBLE TEXT: While our lessons are printed in the bulletin, you may appreciate reading them in their context from our pew Bibles; if so, note that the page number for each lesson is included.

THE ALTAR PARAMENTS are White (the color symbolizing holiness) for Tranfiguration, reminding us that Jesus revealed His Godly glory on this mountain, right before He began heading to Jerusalem and the mount of Calvary outside of it, so that we would know that He **allowed** all of that pain and suffering to be done to Him there, to make us holy and give us heaven as His forgiven children! He was no victim! He is our willing Savior!

THEME OF THE DAY

With the Transfiguration, the Epiphany season reaches its climax and comes to a close. Here on a mountain, Jesus' identity as the Son of God is wondrously revealed. This is the fitting lead-in to Lent, where Jesus shows us another glory in His suffering and death. Here the Father calls us to <u>listen</u> to His Son, who makes us co-heirs with Him in His glory!

Help us to know what is eternal that we may hold fast to it, and show us what will not last so that we may not be distracted by its fading glory; through Jesus Christ, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

THE WORD OF THE DAY


OLD TESTAMENT: EXODUS 34:29-35 (found on page 73 of your pew Bibles)

When Moses came down from Mount Sinai with the two tablets of the covenant law in his hands, he was not aware that his face was radiant because he had spoken with the Lord. When Aaron and all the Israelites saw Moses, his face was radiant, and they were afraid to come near him. But Moses called to them; so Aaron and all the leaders of the community came back to him, and he spoke to them. Afterward all the Israelites came near him, and he gave them all the commands the Lord had given

him on Mount Sinai. When Moses finished speaking to them, he put a veil over his face. But whenever he entered the Lord's presence to speak with him, he removed the veil until he came out. And when he came out and told the Israelites what he had been commanded, they saw that his face was radiant. Then Moses would put the veil back over his face until he went in to speak with the Lord. (NIV2011)

EPISTLE: 2 CORINTHIANS 3:12-4:2 (found on page 937 of your pew Bibles**)**

Therefore, since we have such a hope, we are very bold. We are not like Moses, who would put a veil over his face to prevent the Israelites from seeing the end of what was passing away. But their minds were made dull, for to this day the same veil remains when the old covenant is read. It has not been removed, because only in Christ is it taken away. Even to this day when Moses is read, a veil covers their hearts. But whenever anyone turns to the Lord, the veil is taken away. Now the Lord is the Spirit, and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom. And we all, who with unveiled faces contemplate the Lord's glory, are being transformed into his image with ever-increasing glory, which comes from the Lord, who is the Spirit.

Therefore, since through God's mercy we have this ministry, we do not lose heart. Rather, we have renounced secret and shameful ways; we do not use deception, nor do we distort the word of God. On the contrary, by setting forth the truth plainly we commend ourselves to everyone's conscience in the sight of God. (NIV2011)

GOSPEL/SERMON TEXT: LUKE 9:28-36 (found on page 841 of your pew Bibles) -

About eight days after Jesus said this, he took Peter, John and James with him and went up onto a mountain to pray. As he was praying, the appearance of his face changed, and his clothes became as bright as a flash of lightning. Two men, Moses and Elijah, appeared in glorious splendor, talking with Jesus. They spoke about his departure,[a] which he was about to bring to fulfillment at Jerusalem. Peter and his companions were very sleepy, but when they became fully awake, they saw his glory and the two men standing with him. As the men were leaving Jesus, Peter said to him, "Master, it is good for us to be here. Let us put up three shelters—one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah." (He did not know what he was saying.)

While he was speaking, a cloud appeared and covered them, and they were afraid as they entered the cloud. A voice came from the cloud, saying, "This is my Son, whom I have chosen; listen to him." When the voice had spoken, they found that Jesus was alone. The disciples kept this to themselves and did not tell anyone at that time what they had seen (NIV2011)

Confession: We join to confess our faith in the Triune God with the **Apostle's Creed I believe in God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth.**

I believe in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried.

He descended into hell. The third day He rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty. From there He will come to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Christian Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.



From your Stewardship Board

A suggestion has been made to our board by a Mt Zion member that in addition to the *Time and Talents* survey we take that asks which talents our members have which might be helpful in our church work, that we also ask if there are talents that members are willing to offer to help their fellow church members with. Help might in the form of lawn mowing, hedge trimming, simple home repair projects, cooking, transportation to and from church or for shopping, etc.

An attempt will be made to bring the two parties together.
